

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
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### A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR

### WHY DID YOU WRITE 'THE BURDEN SHE CARRIED'? WHAT WERE YOUR INSPIRATIONS?

I started writing this book to journal the story, it was meant to be cathartic. And then I thought it would be good for my kids to have something to keep, so they had this story they could show their own children. And then it morphed. So, what started as a form of therapy soon became this book.

Write and cry. Write and cry. It was heartbreaking reliving it.

#### FOR WHOM DID YOU WRITE 'THE BURDEN SHE CARRIED' AND WHY?

this book will resonate with any person who has been touched by disability, trauma, PTSD, anxiety, depression. It will be relevant to anyone who has navigated the health system as an advocate or carer. It's relevant to any person who has "done it tough" in life. How is this book different? This book is about an ordinary family. Just an ordinary family, there is nothing special about them. This story is about not one incident, but multiple incidents and tragedies that keep affecting this family. It is open and real and laced with snapshots of the time, which adds emotion and honesty to the story. There are also moments of humour layered through the tragedy. But this is really just your normal suburban family whose circumstances were well beyond their control. They are not celebrities or famous, they are just a family. Any family will identify with this. It's tragic, sad and inspirational.

### WHAT ARE YOUR PLANS FOR YOUR FUTURE BOOKS?

A book called "Everyone has a story" that is a compilation of stories about other people's extraordinary circumstances. My cousin who had cancer, and her husband then had one of the rarest forms of cancer, both before they were 40 – beat the odds. Another friend who had a AAA and survived..... people who have a story worth telling.

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
