



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
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A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR

WHY DID YOU WRITE 'THE ISLANDS'? WHAT WERE YOUR INSPIRATIONS?


Watching the devastating impact of the Chinese colonisation of the South China Sea and its (ironic) repetition of the British colonisation of the Chinese seaboard two centuries earlier inspired me to write 'The Islands'.

This is part of a larger picture, exemplified in the sad decline of Hong Kong, and the emergency of a new world power: no worse than previous global super-powers, but not to be welcomed for all that.

HOW DID YOU DECIDE ON THE CHARACTERS FOR YOUR BOOK?

This book begins with a piece from 'The Tempest' and two of the key characters that had to feature in it were Miranda and Prospero, albeit much, much changed.

The characters come out of the story, but then they take on a life of their own and drive the story (which is exactly what happens in 'The Islands': one of the characters is writing a novel, but it turns out the characters she has invented have lives of their own and end up more creative than she is).



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
